CHRISTMAS: FAITH, FAMILY AND FRIENDS CELEBRATION

MERRY CHRISTMAS AND HAPPY NEW YEAR!

The celebration of Christmas is a special season that reminds us of the importance of faith, family, and friends in our life. The Gospel of Matthew has the story of the genealogy of the messiah, Jesus Christ. It contains different kinds of people we see and encounter in our faith community, in our families, and in society as friends. There is no perfect institution in this world. The visible side of the church is not perfect. No family is perfect. Hence, the need for the messiah. The early Christians experienced the living presence and coming of Jesus with absolute certainty. The mutual greeting was Aramaic "Maranatha" which means "Come Lord Jesus" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2817).

As we gather to celebrate, let us be ready to meet the Lord in our disguised parishioners, family members and friends. The central message for our preparation to celebrate Christmas is repentance. We have to remove all obstacles and make the way straight to receive the Lord. Celebrating Christmas means the affirmation of the present, which becomes fully possible only by remembering the past and expecting more to come in the future. This is why the church is motivating us to appreciate in word and action the presence of our saviour Jesus Christ in history, in mystery, and in majesty. Let us have the determination to serve like Jesus who came to serve not to be served (Matt. 20:28). Our celebration of Christmas must be rooted and grounded in our love for God for our joy to be complete. Of course, if we are motivated by the love of God, no amount of ingratitude will be able to hinder us from serving one another. Love in action is service and where love is, joy is shared and sorrow eased.

One of the overwhelming implications of the incarnation (Jn 1:14) is that God became human so that humans might become God. As children of one family of God, conditions of our relationship include our common experience (being forgiven sinners); our common interest (Jesus whom all Christians want to know, obey and love) and our common goal (to make Christ known to all people). There is only one relationship that really matters, and that is your personal relationship to your personal redeemer and Lord. If you maintain that at all costs, letting everything else go, God will fulfil His purpose through your life. One individual life may be of priceless value to God's purposes, and yours may be that life.

Christmas is a season of giving gifts because we have all received the greatest gift of redemption. We live in a world where so many people feel entitled to favours. Nobody deserves gifts. Nobody is entitled to favours. Gifts and favours reflect the generosity of the giver, not the worthiness of the receiver. May we celebrate this Christmas as a gift, empowering us to become agents of gifts to other people who may come in contact with us. Let us become channels of peace to all. Let us love as we have been loved by Christ. Let us forgive as we have been forgiven by Christ. Simply put, if we are able to see and encounter every *human* being as Jesus Christ in disguise (Matt. 25:40), we would have made this the best Christmas ever. Our New year will be truly a *New year* if we keep Christ in Christmas, because that is the reason for the season.
